### What is Grad PLUS?

Grad PLUS loans are Federal Direct PLUS Loans that provide a critical pathway for graduate and professional students to finance the full cost of their education, including tuition, room and board, and other important living expenses. Capping the amount of federal financial aid graduate students can borrow would have devastating effects on graduate student debt and decrease the diversity of the future physician workforce, to the detriment of patient health.

# Why save Grad PLUS?

- Sixty-seven percent<sup>1</sup> of osteopathic medical students who graduated in the 2018–2019 academic year relied on Grad PLUS loans.
- Forty-eight percent<sup>2</sup> of medical students received Grad PLUS loans in academic year 2015–2016.
- Graduate student loan borrowers typically have much lower rates of default on their Grad PLUS loans (2%)<sup>3</sup> compared to other types of student borrowers.

To address the physician workforce shortage and protect patient health, **please save Grad PLUS in the reauthorization of the** *Higher Education Act.*
